This **Christmas** we helped six local families with gift cards to Sunes Grocery, gave \$150 to the Clinic's "Lights of Love" campaign, and had 50-60 people for our Christmas Eve Service.

After conducting a survey of people's church experience, I reflected on the highlights in my January Digest article. Over half of the 35 respondents were not regular church attenders. The major reason given was that they had felt judged or had been emotionally hurt by a Christian. At Lighthouse, we are looking for ways to heal that experience through the unconditional love of the Father.


